# Patient Airlift Services

## PALS SkyHope

There is another great aviation charity organization based on Long Island, NY next to the Farmingdale, NY Republic Airport (KFRG) called Patient Airlift Services; "PALS SkyHope" for short. There are a few volunteers operating out of Western New York (along with many other locations). Qualified pilots volunteer their time and aircraft to fly ambulatory patients and veterans (and their families) around to medical appointments. PALS often breaks up long flights into two or more legs in order to have each leg be more manageable for both the pilots and the passengers. Pilots can then sign up for just one leg, if that is more appealing or doable for them. However, that is not required, since pilots may fly the entire flight if they want to.

Flights are called, "missions" and are mostly east of the Mississippi River and along the East Coast. Other PALS and non-PALS pilots and passengers may ride along, as long as they are listed on the manifest. You can think of it sort of like Buffalo, NY's Wings of Hope program.

### *From PALS:*

Volunteers are needed! Use your time and talent to help people in need. Patient AirLift Services arranges free air transportation for medical care, special needs camps, humanitarian, and other compelling needs. Many people cannot reach needed care because of the cost, or they are too ill to fly commercially or drive long distances. Join our special volunteers in this unique community service as a pilot, non-pilot, or "Auto Pilot" volunteer.

### **Basic PALS Command Pilot Requirements:**

- 350 hours total time for single engine
- 500 hours total time with 400 hours PIC for multi or turbine
- IFR rating
- 50 hours PIC in aircraft to be flown
- Access to an aircraft (own, rent, or borrow)

Certificated pilots not meeting Command Pilot requirements are eligible to sign up as Mission Assistants, which is essentially being a co-pilot on the mission and helping out with whatever the pilot and passengers need during the flight.

You can also volunteer as an "Auto-Pilot", driving patients between the airport and their treating or lodging facility.

### **Auto Pilot Requirements:**

- 18 years or older
- Access to a vehicle with proper insurance
- Ability to navigate within metropolitan areas

Pilots can login to the PALS website to see what mission requests are posted, and then pick and choose which ones they would like to request. Sometimes requests are planned months ahead of time, and sometimes one can pop up within a day or so. Sometimes, PALS will email or call looking for assistance, but there is no obligation to accept. Canceling flights for weather or mechanical reasons is very easy, but the more advance notice you give the PALS staff, the easier it is for them to execute their backup plans to get the patients to where they were scheduled to go. Some patients have experience flying in small planes, some will be first time flyers, and some will be repeats that you will get to know. This information is listed on their individual trip request along with body and baggage weights and other special information/requests.

Lisa Hotung and I are both members, with our aircraft based at Lancaster (KBQR). We have pictures and stories to share if anyone is interested. Together, we've done nearly a dozen of these flights in the past couple of years.

Are you a female pilot or student pilot? Are you looking for camaraderie, support and scholarships? Join the Ninety-Nines! We are the international organization of women pilots that promotes advancement of aviation through education,

scholarships and mutual support while honoring our unique history and sharing our passion for flight. We have over 7,000 members from 44 countries, organized into Sections and Chapters. In this area, we are part of either the Western New York Chapter or the Finger Lakes Chapter. Both of those chapters, along with 6 more, belong to the NY-NJ Section.

The 99s was founded on November 2, 1929 at Curtiss Field, Valley Stream, Long Island, New York by noted aviator Amelia Earhart and other early women pilots. Of the 117 licensed women pilots of the day, 99 became charter members of the organization and took the name from their number.

Each year Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarships are awarded to qualified members for fully funded advanced flight training, jet type ratings and technical training. In addition, the AEMSF provides Research Scholarship Grants and New Pilot Awards. Many Chapters and Sections around the world also offer scholarships (e.g., the NY-NJ Section offers at least one \$1500 scholarship each year, and the Finger Lakes Chapter offered a \$2,000 scholarship this year).

Chapters and Sections sponsor educational programs like aerospace workshops for teachers, airport tours for school children, fear-of-flying clinics for airline passengers, and flight instructor revalidation seminars. For many years, 99s have co-sponsored more than 75 percent of the FAA pilot safety programs in the United States. Members have worked with the National Intercollegiate Flying Association's student flying competitions since 1948 as judges, runners, and teachers, as well as with funding assistance. More recently, the 99s became sponsors for the Girl Scouts of America offering Aviation Day programs.

Ninety-Nines are professional pilots for airlines, industry and government; we are pilots who teach and pilots who fly for pleasure; we are pilots who are technicians and mechanics. But first and foremost, we are women who love to fly!

The WNY Chapter meets at Lancaster Airport (KBQR). We try to meet every couple of months. In the past, we have had fly-outs to places like Dansville, Penns Caves, and Corning, just to have lunch! We are hoping to have more fly-outs this summer. We'd love to have you join us!



### **Helpful Basic Med Links**

---

December 2024 changes made through the FAA Reauthorization Act of 2024:

- Pilots can carry up to six passengers, increasing the total number of occupants in the aircraft to seven
- Takeoff weight increased from 6,000 lbs. to 12,500 lbs.
- Pilot examiners can conduct flight checks in aircraft covered by BasicMed
- The duration of the comprehensive medical examination is determined using calendar months
- Transport category rotorcraft certified to airworthiness standards under part 29 are **not** covered by BasicMed
